



The following are among the reasons identified by PhilGEPS affecting the posting compliance by agencies:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. Lack of compliance on the mandatory posting of awards/notices; and b. Lack of technical knowledge by the agencies' BAC Secretariat on the use of PhilGEPS. <p>- Increase in the notices posted is possibly due to the increase on the number of procurement activities by agencies.</p> <p>-The influx of postings may have been brought by the constant reminders of the GPPB to the agencies of their obligation to post.</p> <p>-The number of complaints handled by the division is dependent on the submissions made to the office by the bidders.</p> <p>-The number of protests/blacklisting orders posted is dependent on the submissions made to the office by the agencies of the orders and resolutions.</p>
